Trinity Catholic College is Dunedin's only faith-based co-educational school offering education from Year 7 to Year 13. This environment offers a depth and continuity few other schooling models can match. Students benefit from seamless academic progression, strong pastoral care, and rich social learning — all on one campus.




Excellence through Sport

Enrolment

We welcome you to join us at Trinity. Find out how your child can begin their journey at our special place.

Preference of Enrolment is given to those who have an established link with the Catholic Church. For more information about preference criteria, please see the Enrolment Form and website.

A Preference of Enrolment Certificate must accompany your application for enrolment.

In recent years, the Proprietor has determined that students without preference who have been in Catholic contributing schools have already established a connection with the Special Character of the school and should be treated as preference for the purpose of enrolment.

He has also determined that brothers and sisters of students enrolling without preference should be given the opportunity to enrol, as the family has demonstrated a commitment to the Special Character.

If preference applications exceed the places available, then these determinations may not apply.

Open Place (Discretionary) Enrolments are limited to 5% of the total roll. There are limited places in Year 7 and beyond. For this reason, these enrolments have a closing date every year, after which interviews will take place to meet with the young person and their family before a decision is made. Please check the website for the closing date for open place enrolments.

Zoning does not apply to Trinity Catholic College

Because we are an integrated college for the Catholic community of Dunedin and beyond, zoning does not apply. We welcome students from all wider Dunedin urban and rural schools.

The Cost of Attending Trinity Catholic College

Costs associated with enrolments at Trinity are the same as for any secondary school, but with the addition of Attendance Dues.

Payment to the Diocese

Attendance Dues are legally binding charges made by integrated schools as specified in the Education and Training Act 2020. For more information, and for current year charges, please see the Attendance Dues documentation at the back of the prospectus.

Payment to the College

Trinity Catholic College, does not qualify for the Government's School Donation Scheme. Therefore, we ask parents to pay a Voluntary Contribution annually. This helps us provide extra resources and provide a value added education experience.

We endeavour to keep all costs at a reasonable level wherever possible.
