

Vision & History

Kavanagh College is a Catholic, integrated, co-educational school serving Years 7-13 located in central Dunedin.

We aim to

- Live and teach the values of Jesus Christ as a community.
- Seek to achieve excellence in every facet of school life.
- Respect the culture, dignity, self esteem, rights and individuality of each student.
- Develop students as confident, connected and actively involved citizens of our city, province and country.
- Honour the Charter as agreed with the Proprietor and the Minister of Education.

History

Catholic Education began on the site in 1874 making Kavanagh College one of the oldest Catholic schools in New Zealand. The College serves the city area and environs, and aims to provide excellence in education for Catholic students and others whose parents choose a Catholic education for their children.

St Dominic's was the first Catholic secondary school in New Zealand, established in 1871, and soon followed by the Christian Brothers' School in 1876. The latter became St Paul's High School in 1964.


Moreau College resulted from the amalgamation of St Dominic's and St Philomena's Girls' Colleges.

Kavanagh College was established in 1989 with the amalgamation of Moreau College, St Paul's High School and St Edmund's School.

The founding schools of Kavanagh College have provided a rich history of achievement for the new College. Each founding school has a history based around a religious order and all these traditions contribute to the life of our school. Kavanagh College is proud of its links with the Dominican Order, the Mercy Order and the Christian Brothers.







Special Character

As a Catholic College, Kavanagh College supports parents in their role as first educators of their children's faith.

This support is offered through Religious Education Programmes offered at all levels of the school, prayers at the beginning of each day, class and school masses, opportunities for reconciliation, special liturgies for the Church's year, retreats and weekly assemblies.

In all these programmes the school promotes the dignity of the individual as a child of God.

Enrolment

Preference of Enrolment is given to those who have an established link with the Catholic Church

- through Baptism
- membership of a Parish
- or decided by your Parish Priest

A preference certificate must accompany your application for enrolment.

In recent years, the Proprietor has determined that students without preference who have been in Catholic contributing schools, have already established a connection with the Special Character of the school and should be treated as preference for the purpose of enrolment.

He has also determined that brothers and sisters of students enrolling without preference should be given the opportunity to enrol, as the family has demonstrated a commitment to the Special Character. If preference applications exceed the places available, then these determinations may not apply.

Students without preference

- · are welcome to apply
- enrolment is restricted to 5% of the total roll


Zoning does not apply to Kavanagh College.

Life is Co-ed

Learning together in a co-ed classroom has many benefits for both genders. Whether at work or in the home, men and women cooperate in their daily lives all the time and students who attend a co-education school are introduced to the benefits of this type of environment well before they enter the workforce - giving them a conceivably distinct advantage.

Practise is the best way to master social skills that will help students solve conflict, problem solve and work well in groups. Co-ed schools provide students with the practice they need to master these social skills which better prepares them for success in university and the workforce.

Co-ed environment teach students to have respect for their opposite sex peers, expose them to different viewpoints and some say help to break down gender sterotypes.





The cost of attending Kavanagh College

Attendance Dues:

These are fees paid to the Proprietor, The Bishop, for building the school and maintaining the buildings.

Years 7 and 8 \$450.00 per annum incl. 15% GST

Years 9 to 13 \$875.00 per annum incl. 15% GST

Fees Paid to the School:

Parents pay a School Activity Contribution each year.

The amount is determined by the year level of students.

Currently the contribution is Years 7 & 8: \$120.00, Years 9 & 10: \$140.00 and Years 11-13: \$170.00.

A reduction is available when there is more than one student in a family.

This does not cover class trips, retreats, camps or sports registrations.



We believe that co-curricular activities are an important part of our student's holistic education and development.


